Fall deep.

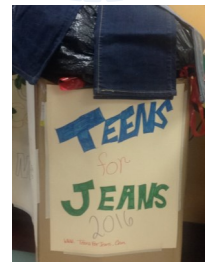
Chess Club

Chess Club meets on Friday during 7th period in room 106. You must have permission from your 7th period teacher to attend a chess club session.



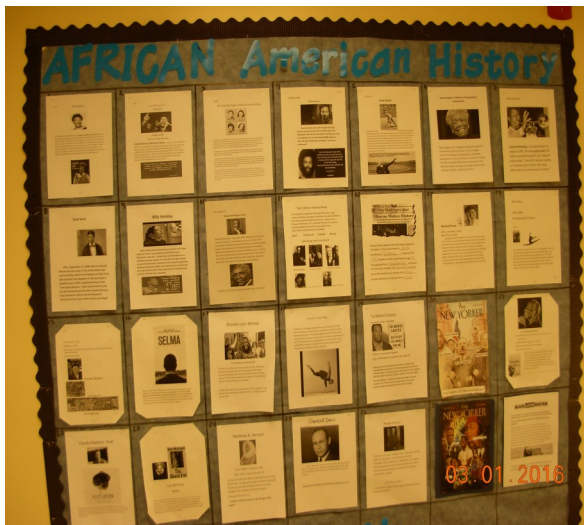
