Grant applications are accepted from March 1 through April 30.

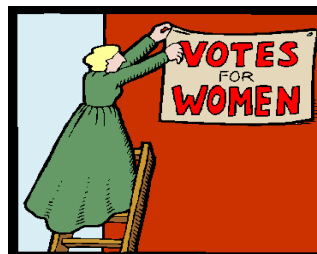
