“Teaching Books” is an easy-to-use website that adds a multimedia dimension to the reading experiences of children's and young adult books. The online database is developed and maintained to include thousands of resources about fiction and nonfiction books used in the K–12 environment, with every resource selected to encourage the integration of multimedia

author and book materials into reading and library activities.

“Tumble Talking Books” allows you to listen to or download your favorite audio books with just the click of a button. Listen online, bookmark your spot, or download the book and access your books off-line at your convenience.



Use these two databases together to create a great lesson based around a book. Pick an audio book from Tumble Talking Books, and use Teaching Books to find lesson plans, author programs, book guides, and other related resources.

You must use the links from the library website for authentication purposes:

Teaching Books - Username and password are **dcboces**.

Talking Tumble Books - You must have an account with any library in the Mid-Hudson Library System. Use the barcode from your library card and pin number to log in.
